

TRAILS CONTINUED

■ **Burton Drive** • EAST LODGE HILL

From Burton Drive and Eton Road (Cambria Nursery) intersection. Outside guard rail down Burton to bridge over Santa Rosa Creek. (approx .25 miles)

■ **Strawberry Canyon** • LODGE HILL

Two acquisitions by Greenspace, the Cambria Land Trust, provide hiking in Strawberry canyon. This .25 mile loop trail starts about 150 feet west of trailhead. Easy.

■ **Fern Canyon (Henry Kluck Trail)** • LODGE HILL

This trail passes through Fern Canyon and is located at the end of Camborne Place (off Ardath, near Burton Drive) ending on Fern Drive. Distance: approximately .75 miles. Easy.

■ **Santa Rosa Creek West** • PARK HILL

From CCSD's Waste Water Treatment Plant by Windsor Blvd. Bridge. Newly improved. Runs along and above west side of Santa Rosa Creek. Steep hill, fairly close to Windsor Blvd. entrance. Access to West Fiscalini Ranch Preserve and Highway One. Benches available. (approx 1.5 miles)



Parks

■ **Shamel Park** • PARK HILL

County park on Windsor Blvd. North. Playing field, summer swimming pool, barbecues, picnic tables, children's play area, restrooms. (6 acres on beach)

■ **Lampton Cliffs Park** • MARINE TERRACE

County park with trails, two benches. Overlooks ocean at Sherwood and Lampton. Beach access. (2.1 acres)

■ **Nottingham Bluffs** • PARK HILL

State Park on Nottingham between Dorset and Worcester. Off of Windsor Blvd. North. Bench. (3 acres)

■ **Beach Access** • MARINE TERRACE, LODGE HILL

Easy access at Lampton, Harvey and Wedgewood Streets (off Sherwood Drive). Rough access to Otter Cove at south end of West Fiscalini Ranch Preserve.



■ **Moonstone Beach State Parklands**

Includes Leffingwell Landing, Moonstone Beach Drive bluff trail, and Santa Rosa Creek access—from Shamel Park. (3 acres)

■ **Andy's Garden** • PARK HILL

Privately maintained park at Guildford and Worcester Drives. Beautifully landscaped corner park with benches for public enjoyment.

■ **Leffingwell Landing** • MOONSTONE BEACH

From Shamel Park (Windsor Blvd. North) to Leffingwell Landing on Moonstone Beach or on bluff trail adjacent to Moonstone Beach Drive. (1.9 miles)

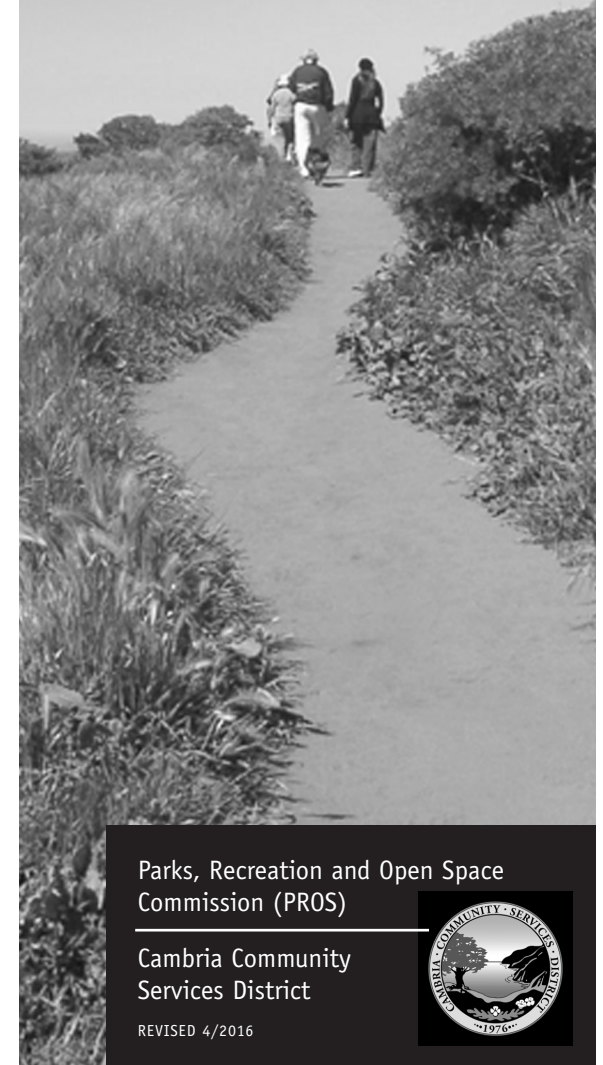
■ **Leffingwell Landing Park/San Simeon Beach State Park**

Begin at north parking area of Leffingwell Landing, across from Hamlet Restaurant and Moonstone Gardens. Walk north on trail, then down steps to beach and north to San Simeon Creek.

■ **San Simeon Beach State Park** • INLAND

Park on north side of Highway One near San Simeon Creek Bridge. Trail begins at end of boardwalk and continues south across wetland and up into pine trees. Side trail to overlook above San Simeon Creek and the Park. Main trail cuts north along side of bluff, crossing creek or boggy area on another boardwalk, then up a long hill to upper State Park camping area. Cut left along east side of campsites and down along road to starting point. Or, continue through narrow stile to larger loop east, go north and down to eucalyptus grove, then back to starting point. Moderate. (approx 3 miles)

Trails

■ Fiscalini Ranch Preserve

The Ranch is divided into two parcels: 364 acres on the west side of Highway One dedicated to passive recreation activities and 70 acres on the east side of Highway One, of which approximately 25 acres have been designated as an active recreation community park.



West Fiscalini Ranch Preserve • 364 acres

There are 11 trails on the West Ranch. Easy or moderately easy to use. Beware of poison oak. The newly improved, one-mile Bluff Trail and Marine Terrace Trail are most frequently used. Accessible to wheelchairs and hikers, the Bluff Trail runs along the coastal bluff from Windsor Boulevard North to South and is part of the 1,100-mile California Coastal Trail system. The Marine Terrace Trail runs from the north end of Windsor Boulevard to Marlborough Drive south and is inland and parallel to the Bluff Trail. Accessible to wheelchairs, hikers, and bicyclists. See map to locate other trails on the West Fiscalini Ranch Preserve.

East Fiscalini Ranch Preserve • 70 acres

Can be accessed via pedestrian bridge next to the Bluebird Motel on Main Street and several trails: Berry Trail at end of Pine Court (off Rogers Way) in East Lodge Hill. Steep, unimproved trail connecting with Rodeo Grounds Road 100 yards west of the Burton Drive Bridge over Santa Rosa Creek. East Santa Rosa Creek Trail at end of Rodeo Grounds Road. Easy walk; follow sewer easement road. Skye Street Trail near cul-de-sac leading to East Ranch. Wide and fairly steep. Poison oak. Ramsey Avenue Trail drops down to Fern Creek and parallels Hwy. One to East Santa Rosa Creek Trail.
