#### **RECOMMENDATIONS:**

Staff recommends that the Board discuss and consider the use of Proposition (Prop) 68 Per Capita Funding for the Skatepark project.

#### FISCAL IMPACT:

There is no financial impact associated with discussion of this item. Based on the Board's direction to staff, a future budget adjustment could be necessary to appropriate Prop 68 Per Capital funding for the Skatepark project.

#### **DISCUSSION:**

This staff report focuses on the use of California State Parks grant funding (Prop 68) toward the Cambria Community Services District (CCSD) Skatepark project, and not on the District's support or the merits of the Skatepark project.

The California Department of Parks and Recreation, through the Parks and Water Bond Act of 2018 (Proposition 68), a State of California bill approved by voters on June 5, 2018, provides funding through the General Per Capita Program, for local park rehabilitation, creation, and improvement grants to local governments on a per capita basis. Grant recipients are encouraged to utilize awards to rehabilitate existing infrastructure and to address deficiencies in neighborhoods lacking access to the outdoors.

The program is managed by the Department's Office of Grants and Local Services (OGALS) and the available per capita allocation for Cambria is \$177,952. CCSD staff was contacted by OGALS regarding this program in June 2020 and attended an OGALS application workshop on July 24, 2020. The application process is significant and is outlined though the OGALS procedural guide which may be found at: <a href="https://www.parks.ca.gov/?page\_id=30095">https://www.parks.ca.gov/?page\_id=30095</a>. The deadline for CCSD's application package is December 31, 2021.

As stated in presentation at the special Board meeting on October 30, 2021, Aaron Spohn, skate park designer from Spohn Ranch, and Ray Dienzo, District Engineer, presented the proposed skate park conceptual plan at the location on Main Street across the street from the Veterans Hall. Spohn and Dienzo met with the County of SLO permitting team at a pre-application meeting

on October 25<sup>th</sup> and County staff summarized the engineering and permitting requirements for the project. Though there are challenges relating to requirements for parking, storm basins, environmental factors, various setbacks, and restrooms, the development plan permit is a flexible higher-level discretionary permit. This means the development plan goes before the Planning Commission for consideration and allows the applicant to include requests to modify, waive or exempt certain land use standards (e.g., some the requirements stated above).

Since the October 25<sup>th</sup> meeting, there has been no additional feedback from the County, but these issues will be made clear when the Land Use Permit application process is started. Staff is awaiting Board direction to proceed with the permitting phase of the project, which would include officially filling out and submitting the Land Use Permit application.

Presently, the Skatepark project has some challenges and issues that are summarized as follows:

- Exemptions may be needed with potential options to satisfy County Planning –
  parking requirements, restroom requirements, a potential crosswalk for more
  parking access, curbs, gutters and sidewalk
- Other potential required studies sound, geological, environmental, archeological
- Maintenance not addressed in Spohn Ranch Design retaining wall, swale, storm water basin, and fencing

The Spohn Ranch Design presented a cost estimate of \$661,000. No cost contingencies were applied to this estimate, so as the engineering design moves toward preparing construction documents, the engineering team could identify value and cost savings depending on the types of exemptions that are approved during the permitting process. Additionally, there is a potential for project costs to exceed the estimated amount of \$661,000, due to permitting requirements, material supply & demand cost escalations, and construction cost contingencies, which may result in additional project costs of approximately \$400,000.

The Skatepark project is currently a multi-year project budgeted at \$19,965. This budget was approved by the Board on May 20, 2021, for design services and is funded by the General Fund. To move forward with the Prop 68 Per Capita grant funding, the Board would be required to commit total project funding, along with identifying each funding source, by the grant submittal deadline of December 30, 2021. The estimated project costs and funding sources are as follows:

The General Fund is currently the only source of funds to address the project deficit of \$759,971, as detailed above. The General Fund reserves are estimated to be \$3,238,163 at June 30, 2022. The General Fund revenues are largely derived from property taxes and are used to fund the operations & maintenance of Fire, Facilities & Resources, PROS and Administrative Departments.

In conclusion, staff recommends that the Board discuss and consider the issues, limitations and constraints in its deliberations on the Prop 68 Per Capita funding for the Skatepark project.

Section 7.08.010 of the CCSD Municipal Code provides that the Board of Directors may appoint, by resolution, ex officio members to the PROS Commission to serve as non-voting members who are representatives from significant constituencies served by the parks and recreation department.

At the October 5, 2021 PROS Commission meeting, a motion was passed requesting that the Board appoint a member of Skate Cambria to the PROS Commission as an ex-officio member.
